### Deadline:

■ April 21, 2021. Complete applications must be received by the deadline. Incomplete and late applications will not be accepted. No exceptions will be made to this rule.

### **Award Restrictions:**

- Applicants must permanently reside in Lincoln, Pike, St. Charles or Warren counties in Missouri.
- Funds are for on-campus expenses only such as tuition, books, and campus housing.
- Scholarships will be awarded in an amount not to exceed \$1,000 per academic year.
- Scholarships are not renewable. Applicants who choose to reapply must submit a new completed application. Previous applications are not kept on file.
- Scholarships are available for Undergraduate and Adult Education/Vocational Training students attending accredited schools.
- Scholarships are not available for tuition to private grade schools or high schools, or for graduate studies.

## **Selection & Notification Process:**

- Recipients are selected on the basis of educational commitment, community service and financial need.
- Scholarship award recipients will be posted on **www.cuivre.com** on **June 10, 2021** at **2 PM**. Scholarship checks will be made payable to the educational institution and mailed to the student.

☐ Provide a typed, one- or two-page essay highlighting your achievements, school activities, community service and career plans.
☐ A complete copy of your Student Aid Report (SAR) is required. The SAR is the official record that your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was processed. (visit www.fafsa.ed.gov)
☐ Provide two current letters of recommendation from counselors, teachers, employers or other non-relatives. Letters must be written within 3 months of application date.
☐ Provide a current "Official" high school or college transcript. GPA must be 2.5 or higher.

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Incomplete requests will not be considered.
